A lot of knowledge from different areas is required to build a research project. For the development of this researcher's master's project, entitled The Principle of Human Dignity of Elderly Women in a State of Incarceration and Who Do Not Receive Visits, From the Perspective of These Women, the essentiality of studies in three subjects studied in the Postgraduate Program stands out. -Graduation in Studies of the Human Condition: ECH - 003 Interdisciplinarity in research in Human and Social Sciences: epistemological and methodological foundations; ECH 014 – Supervised Teaching Training Internship Program; and - ECH - 016 Topics in Interdisciplinary Studies I – Theme: Aging and the City.

Interdisciplinarity is seen as the basis for the master's research conducted by this researcher, since the facts connect possibly unrelated themes, supposedly disconnected, however, present in the current national reality. Thus, in the search to deepen the theme and give visibility to the relationships present regarding the possible abandonment of incarcerated elderly women and the damage to their human dignity, this project sees in the discipline Interdisciplinarity in research in Human and Social Sciences: epistemological and methodological foundations one of its main pillars.
